SANTIAGO / LIMA

Arrival in Lima, the "City of Kings" famous for its Spanish Colonial architecture, extraordinary museums and cuisine. Lima is internationally recognized as the "Gastronomic Capital of the Americas", and its cuisine is considered among the most diverse and exquisite in the world on par with French cuisine. Upon arrival a host will meet and assist you in transferring to the hotel and in registering Transfer to your hotel in Miraflores

09:00 Guided tour of the more important and characteristic parts of Lima: the Monumental Center, where we will admire the colonial architecture of the Main Square (Plaza Mayor), the Government Palace, the Cathedral, the Archbishop Palace, and some old streets with vice royal mansions and balconies of Moorish style. We will also visit the Convent of San Francisco and its catacombs. Continuing with the tour we will visit the more traditional and residential parts of Lima to end with a spectacular view of the Pacific Ocean and Miraflores beaches.

14.00 visit The Gold Museum. Ancient Peruvians were master metalworkers. The -cire perduell or lost wax process, known across the Orient and lost in the West until the Renaissance, was the most frequent technique used by master ancient Peruvian gold and silversmiths.

On our tour of Peru's Gold Museum, visitors will appreciate a dazzling collection of gold artefacts from various pre-Colombian civilizations, some more than 3,000 years old. Metal pieces and jewellery of incalculable value in gold, silver and precious stones used by the Incas—the children of the Sun God and monarchs of the vast Inca Empire—are shown in this collection. Five hundred years ago, the gold of Peru attracted many European adventurers who conquered the Inca and founded the Vice-Royalty of Peru under the Spanish Crown.

Peru's Gold Museum also houses a valuable collection of old and modern weapons that ranks among the best in the world. The halls in this section show the Arms of the World Collection of armour, uniforms and various ancient war artifacts and weapons from various time periods around the world, some dating back to as long ago as 1300 B.C.

09:00 Your half day sightseeing of this beautiful city, placed on the World Cultural Heritage list by **UNESCO**, features Mixed Baroque churches and mansions from the colonial period like the Monastery of Santa Catalina, The Main Square is bordered by various arched walkways and the Cathedral, it showcase a beautiful bronze fountain of three plates crowned by the figure of a sixteenth century soldier. Around the square, you see three granite portals with brick and lime bases. Also known as the "White City" for its many constructions built of white volcanic stone, Arequipa is at the foothills of the Misti Volcano (the guardian of the city) and it has a splendid Cathedral that is considered one of the first seventeenth century religious monuments of the city

AREQUIPA / COLCA (B/L)

Breakfast

08:00 Departure towards the highlands passing through Yura-Pampa Cañahuas and La Pulpera with good possibility of observing groups of wild vicuñas and fighting cattle. The road to the Colca Canyon reaches a high point of 13,000 feet before dropping down to the valley, an area of breath taking landscapes surrounded by terracing and snow-capped peaks. Far below, at a depth of 10,000 feet, the Colca River winds along the bottom of the canyon, the world's deepest.

Stop en route to see petroglyphs in the Caves of Mollepunco and in the town of Callali to see natural hill formations with the appearance of enchanted castles. Continue to La Calera to enjoy the thermal baths under the stars.

06:00 To maximize your probability of seeing condors we depart very early towards a superb natural lookout point -Cross of the Condorll from where one can watch condors wheeling across the Colca Canyon, at about an altitude of 15,000 feet. The valley also features pre-Inca ruins, pre-Inca burial grounds and archaeological remains left behind by the Collagua, the ancient inhabitants of the area. Drive further in to the canyon to observe the way of life in this remote land and to admire the impressive irrigation system and the fertile mountains terraced for farming of the Colca valley.

Ask your guide to take you to one of the many workshops in which close to a thousand artisans, scattered throughout the towns in the canyon, turn their ancient sewing and weaving machines into paint brushes to give life to impressively intricate and colorful embroidery and shawls.

07:30 Boat excursion to Uros and Taquile Islands on Lake Titikaka. This full day excursion will take you to the highest navigable lake in the world to the floating islands of the Uros Indians, man-made islands by tying totora reeds. The Uros considered themselves Lords of the Lake; they hunt wild birds and maintain traditional fishing methods. The men have developed an extraordinary skill in weaving reeds; producing houses, boats and handicrafts, and the women are expert knitters.

Continuing to Taquile where a native community of about 400 families still lives with the traditions and high principals of the Incas. Taquile is a very important site on Lake Titikaka for its archeological remains, the sacred and ceremonial sites, the festive activities and their rituals. Taquile is characterized by its friendly inhabitants, who maintain their customs and traditional clothing. They distinguish themselves by their detailed, fine, and colorful textiles with symmetrical decorations and symbols that reflect their way of life and Andean beliefs. Lunch is included.

07:00 Bus journey through the Peruvian Andes from Puno to Cusco - Today one of South America's most extraordinary overland trips takes you by coach to Cusco passing through striking highland scenery and picturesque Andean villages. Brief stops at Raqchi to see the remains of the remarkable temple of Viracocha, considered by the historians an important Inca construction, and at the town of Andahuaylillas, a showcase of the colonial art in Peru, sometimes called "the Sistine Chapel of America". Lunch is included.

09:00 Tour of Cusco and Nearby Ruins – Visitors are caught up in the excitement of touring the ancient capital of the Inca Empire, a delightful combination of Inca and colonial architecture. The tour visits important landmarks such us Cusco's Cathedral, Santo Domingo Church, Plaza de Armas and Koricancha -The Temple of the Sunll. This tour of the oldest continuously inhabited city in the western hemisphere also includes the nearby ruins of Kenko, Puca-Pucara, Tambomachay as well as the Sacsayhuaman fortress, an imposing example of Inca military architecture.

CUSCO / URUBAMBA (B/L)

Breakfast/Lunch

08:00 Full Day Excursion to the Pisac Indian Market and the Ollantaytambo Fortress - Morning departure for a drive through the fertile countryside of the Urubamba Valley to the colonial village of Pisac where an Indian Market takes place Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. Other days you will tour the religious nucleus and archaeological site of Pisac. During your visit to the bustling marketplace you will have the opportunity to bargain with the natives for many different types of Peruvian handicrafts and jewelry.

Continue to the Ollantaytambo archaeological complex, the Incas built it as a fort that included a temple, agricultural terraces, and an urban area.

There are two distinct sectors: The religious and worship zone, and the residential area. Ollantaytambo was an important administrative center with probable military functions if one considers the walls and towers.

There are also traces of ancient roads and aqueducts. The town of Ollantaytambo is called a "Living Inca Town" since the inhabitants maintain very old practices and customs.

URUBAMBA (BL)

Chichubamba Agrotourism village. It is a project developed by the residents of Chichubumba and the NGO Pro Peru, designed to help improve theeconomic conditions of those living in this area. The agrotourism project brings together many different families in Chichumbamba who continue to farm weave or make other products in the traditional manner. Through the use of small interactive and very informative demonstrations the very friendly residents immerced us in the Andean Culture. There are several activities to choose for example:

Bee keeping, ceramics, chichi (locally brewed corn beer) weaving, chocolate, horticulture and cuy (guinea pig) breeding, potter. In addition you can sample the all natural, locally grown and freshly made typical Andean dish of cuy served with corn and potatoes.

The activities we chose were pottery, chocolat and bees keeping. We were then treated to a delicious lunch at Eufracia's home (the pottery lady). If you are reading my blog and thinking of visiting Urumbumba I encourage you to visit Chichubamba and contribute to the local community.

Hike back to your hotel and either relax in the beautiful garden to read and write up our diary's, and pack for our overnight hike tomorrow to Misminay.

Transfer Ollantaytambo along the route Cusco - Urubamba - Cusco to the small town of Chequerec, located in a branch of this main road heading west. From this small town will begin the flat walk through an extensive area, but without climbs and descents, and finally arriving at the rural community of Misminay 3700 mtrs. The view from hear is outstanding taking in the snow capped mountains and superb landscape. The walk is approximately 4 to 5 hours and it will give you the opportunity to interact with these small indigenous villagers. Families live in tiny farms of sometimes one bedroom housing the whole family. They are subsistence farmers growing crops such as corn, potatoes, beans. During the walk we will pass through some amazing scenery on trails traditionally used by the Indians centuries ago

Option anyone has the option of going in the vehicle.

Lunch at the Community Misminay and a weaving demonstration.

Afternoon visit the community and participation in basic activities of harvesting crops and preparation of bricks for houses. We will spend the night with the local community and you will experience a wonderful adventure.
